Educational Objective:

The Tourism Think Tank is a 3-credit activity aimed at encouraging in students a critical attitude for analyzing the complexity of tourism, focusing on particular case studies and their responsible and critical management for the development of sustainable territorial ecosystems. In the academic year 2025-2026, it is planned to continue an in-depth study of the importance of analyzing cultural heritage and its promotion for tourism, respecting the principles of the Faro Convention, i.e. a heritage for all, through a series of activities involving different institutions at different scales.

Activities:

- introductory seminars on theoretical and methodological aspects related to a critical approach to tangible and intangible heritage, tourism and accessibility.
- meetings with stakeholders, to understand the critical issues and potentials of the enhancement of tangible and intangible heritage also considering governance useful for the implementation of a strategic plan aimed at ensuring the accessibility of heritage, both tangible and intangible.
- field trips to visit different UNESCO sites to understand tangible and intangible heritage and the challenges they are facing in becoming accessible.
- group work organized independently by students.
- presentations of the results of the students' work.
