#### PRESENTATION OF THE INITIATIVE

The **BIP COME** is a programme organised within the Eramsus+ framework, with a blended format (virtual sessions & physical mobility) including academics from at three member-universities (University of Bergamo, Université Lumière Lyon2 and Dalarna University) to ensure transnational participation.

The programme is shared by **5 Master's and 1 Bachelor's Degree** of the three universities:

#### **University of Bergamo**

- LM PMTS Planning and Management of Tourism Systems
- LM GEOU Geourbanistica

#### Université Lumière Lyon2

- M2 Master en Tourisme
- M2 Master Villes et environnements urbains

#### **Dalarna University**

- Master in Tourism Destination Development
- Bachelor in International Tourism Management

**The BIP involves 29 students**: 19 students who travel to Italy for training and other 10 students from the University of Bergamo which has applied for organisational support funds for the BIP. There are **7 professors involved** from the three universities and they have adopted a transdisciplinary approach, as they teach in different courses and belong to different disciplines. A team of **6 research collaborators** of Imago Mundi Lab at the University of Bergamo is actively involved in tutorship and support to teaching activities.

The **physical mobility** activity of the BIP is 5 days (23-27 October 2023) and professors of the three universities teach together online and in presence from October 5<sup>th</sup> to December 5<sup>th</sup>.

The **BIP awards 6 ECTS credits** corresponding to a module in the study plan identified for the recognized credits:

For students enrolled in PMTS these courses will be recognized:

- a) curriculum Environmental and digital strategies: Environment and sustainable tourism (1st year) or Geotracking and webmapping for tourism (2nd year);
- b) curriculum Global issues in tourism management: Environment and sustainable tourism (1st year) or a free choice.

For students enrolled in Geourbanistica these courses will be recognized:

Teoria del Progetto territoriale (1st year) or Rigenerazione e recupero delle aree dismesse/Protezione dell'ambiente e tutela del paesaggio (2nd year).

Admitted students will be informed about the details of the recognition.

#### **Topics**

The programme tries to answer the need of interdisciplinary competences in adaptive and creative planning related to European urban hubs of mobility and flows seen in a polycentric and multiscale perspective.

For this reason, professor of different disciplines of the three Universities face these topics:

- Urbanities/Urbanocene/Polycentric and multiscale approaches to urbanities
- Urban mobility and flows
- Urban challenges related to mobility flows: overtourism, gentrification, intermodal mobility planning, hyperplaces, ...
- Inhabitants' dynamics: residency, tourisms, migrations, commuting, ...
- Processes for sustainable cities' development: co-creative and collaborative governance, adaptive planning, urban regeneration

#### **Teaching methods**

The Programme alternates different methods during online and in presence lectures and labs, connecting:

- Challenge based learning: challenges identified with local stakeholders
- Collaborative learning: adopting student-oriented approaches, instant pools, etc.
- **Project-works**: students' work in interdisciplinary thematic teams
- Digital Labs: practical competences about digital mapping, video-making.

#### **GROUP WORK: SCHEDULE AND ORGANISATION**

#### **Objectives**

The main objective of the Group Work is to **study mobility with an interdisciplinary and interactive approach**, combining tourism analysis and planning competences.

Each group will concentrate on a specific topic and urban context of Bergamo, choosing from the case studies visited:

- International flows and overtourism in the destination (i.e. Città Alta)
- accessibility of biodiversity and protected areas in Bergamo (i.e. Astino Valley of biodiversity within the Regional Park of the Hills of Bergamo)
- multi-scale mobility in Bergamo hyper-places (i.e. Il Caravaggio International Airport and Oriocenter)
- the connection of public transportation in Bergamo (i.e. TEB/ATB)
- intermodal mobility infrastructures connecting urban regeneration projects (i.e. Chorus Life)

Starting from the specific characteristics of each context, students will work on a project on mobility, linking together sustainable aspects of movement in both its urban planning and tourism-related aspects.

Thanks to the lectures and seminars provided by Professors of different Universities and disciplines, together with the challenges suggested by the stakeholders, students will be able to include in their projects conceptual analysis about the most important topics that can affect mobility and tourism policies in the contemporary world.

#### Methodology

The theme of co-planning urban mobilities will be studied following a modular approach: the theoretical framework and the reference bibliography given by the lectures; seminars will be the background for the conceptual reflections and practical-experiential activities carried out during both in-presence and distance work.

The first phase is the **analysis of the Bergamo territory** as the main case study of each group: this will be possible thanks to the material provided in advance by tutors and thanks to the field trips and the meeting with the local stakeholders. During the activities outdoors students can **collect multimedia material** that can be used for follow-up activities and can be included in the final works.

The second phase is **planning** and will concern a specific example among the case studies analysed during the fieldtrips. Students are encouraged to reflect on critical issues and potentials, **bringing international examples and making a comparative analysis with their home cities**. A project proposal should be the result of the work.

#### Tools

The Group Work is organised with blended methods, including virtual tools and innovative experiential labs in presence, in particular:

- collaborative tools, on Microsoft Teams and other platforms, will be used during directed work online. Through brainstorming and collaboration work, students will be able to simulate a collaborative learning experience and a digital participation system.
- digital lab on cartography: the Maplab will focus on the preparation of a map about mobility and in line with the group's area of study. The software will be decided according to the students' initial skills.
- collection of multimedia material for the creation of reportages, videos and reels.

- **creative lab**: starting from visual and sound stimuli, students can create an artistic representation related to the theme of their group in a free and personalised format. This activity allows the theme under study to be analysed from an emotional and creative point of view.
- **experiential learning** through an embodied cognition activity: through physical interaction, movement and the support of sensory material, students will be stimulated to investigate their topic of analysis in a more experiential way.

#### **Groups organisation**

Students will be organised into **5 groups** composed by one or two students for each Master's Degree. The groups will be created by the tutors following these criteria:

- university of origin;
- educational background;
- study interests;
- IT skills.

The different geographical and educational backgrounds of the students will facilitate a multidisciplinary and cross-cultural approach to the topics covered. Each group will choose a representative as spokesperson.

#### Results

#### Work format:

At the end of the Group work students could present three works:

- power-point presentation: a group power-point presentation about their topic of analysis
  - first version (October 27, 2023): at least 5 slides (title, objective, bibliography, methodology, expected results)
  - final version: (**December 5, 2023**): presentation of 12 slides which has to include the analysis and work results
- 2. **activity report**: individual paper of at least 20 pages complete with cover page, table of contents, pictures (cartography, photographs, drawings) notes, and bibliography about the theme. **Deadline**: **December 20, 2023**
- 3. **group portfolio**: it can include the most representative products made by the group (photographs, drawings, audio files, reels, videos, etc.). It could be useful to upload the final works in the folder "groups portfolio" in Microsoft Teams.

The works could have this structure:

- Research question (issues and objectives)
- Thematic framework (literature review)
- Methodology and context of analysis
- Field analysis of Bergamo and comparative analysis with Dalarna and Lyon
- Results (criticality, suggestion, project hypothesis)

The final work can have a creative project narrative format, including personal representation, visual materials and multimedia illustrations.

#### **Evaluation criteria**

Every Master's course involved in the BIP Programme will evaluate the final works according to internal criteria.

For the students of the University of Bergamo, both of Geourbanistica and Planning and Management of Tourism Systems, the final works will be evaluated with the following criteria: consistency with the topics covered, completeness of the information, quality of analysis, creativity. The final products include: bibliographical references, comparisons between cities, cartographical elaboration, personal reflection about the experience.

Activity 1: *Ideas and expectations about the city of Bergamo*: Ouestions:

- what is the first word that comes to your mind about Bergamo?
- mobility in a medium european city: which opportunities?
- mobility in a medium european city: which threats?

Activity 2: mobility challenges in mondialisation:

- Questions:
  - what does it mean mobility in the mondialisation? Why people move?
  - which are the opportunities given by mondialisation?
  - and the threats?

Activity 3: Co-planning urban mobility: is it possible? Questions:

- what is the first word that comes to your mind about co-planning and participation?
- do you know a co-planning project on mobility?
- have you ever participated in a co-planning urban project?

Activity 4: First step into Bergamo mobility: starting from a picture related to place and events of mobility, students answer:

- what is your first impression?
- what are your feelings about the image (memories, personal experiences, suggestions)?
- do you find some similarities with your own town?

After the activities, tutors will collect the answers and prepare them as starting materials for the Group work on October 23, 2023.

#### Ready, set... go: definition of final groups and start of work

3pm-4pm: creation of the 5 groups and choice of the spokesperson; each group is given one of five areas of study. Each group is given a starting bibliography and the conceptual maps done during the collaborative activity on October 18, 2023. The maps will be useful to provide some initial ideas about one's own topic and represent a first example of cross-cultural and interdisciplinary meaning-making, as it resulted from the collaborative work of all students on each topic.

#### Feel the city: embodied cognition experience and group work

3pm-3.30pm: updates from the spokespersons on the work of the groups.

3.30pm-4.30pm: **experiential learning and lab of** *embodied cognition* - through different immersion activities and using body language, students will be led to reflect on their study topics through an emotional and sensory approach.

- Activity 1: The movement of music: different mobility-related soundtracks are proposed (metro noise, traffic, bicycle, car, etc.). The students close their eyes and move freely in the space following the emotion given by the music/ and reflect about the emotion given by the music.
- **Activity 2**: What is accessible mobility? Students move freely in the space keeping eyes closed trying to reflect about accessibility and inclusiveness.
- Activity 3: Facing disability and diversities in mobility: some students have eye patches
  and others with earplugs. On the soundtrack they can move and experience a person
  with a disability dealing with mobility.
- **Activity 4** (optional): students think of a smell (such as, for example, rain on asphalt, the smell of take-away pizza, smoke from vehicle exhausts, grass in public spaces, etc.) and say what emotions it arouses in them.




